



Fire Flags work by flashing silver and gold colors into the birds eyes, which are interpreted as fire by the bird. This is effective in deterring most birds to stay away from where the Fire Flag is mounted, including Egyptian Geese, Hadeda Ibis, Pigeons, Starlings and Sparrows.

Fire Flags blow in the wind and rotate freely around on the mounting shaft. These inexpensive and lightweight devices are easy to mount around the area to be protected from birds. Fire Flags should be placed 20m apart at the problem area, and installed 300mm above the area to be protected. The more Fire Flags installed, the better the protection.

Due to the physical design of the Fire Flag, engineered to keep costs down and used to quickly break initial bird infestations over a few months, we do not consider the Fire Flag on its own as a permanent installation on buildings. For long term and long range protection we recommend the installation of the Eagle Eye rotating bird flasher.
